From the Pastor's Study

Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD.

Lord, hear my voice!

Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

Psalm 130:1-2 (NRSV)

As I write this, there still remains a big question as to the toll the new Corona virus will take on the people of the world. It remains unknown how many people will get sick, how many will die, whether the health care system in the U.S. can withstand the strain of such a pandemic.

But we know that a substantial price is already being paid. Some areas of the world and even of the U.S. have been hard hit. And even in places like South Dakota, where there has been relatively little viral activity so far, a price is being paid. We no longer find ourselves making it possible to be physically present with each other. We are being warned against it. Such behavior goes against our Christian nature.

I know that some people are introverts and some are extroverts, and maybe the introverts are having their day, being advised to stay away from everybody else! But introvert or extrovert, we disciples are all called to find ways to love and serve others.

Maybe this pandemic will give us new chances to minister to each other and to others. Maybe we will find that there are really important things we can do for each other, from at least six feet away. Maybe we will see ourselves grow as Christians. I have no doubt that there will be a silver lining or two.

But we do pay a steep price. We are no longer physically together on Sundays, and I will tell you that I am anxious for the time when that situation comes to an end. The way we worship during the season of Lent is particularly crucial to the way we live as Christians. The readings, the message, the songs, the prayers of this season really do play apart in forming us as human beings and as children of God.

As you know, we are trying different things to stay connected. We will be able to worship "together" via our church website. The session and its committees are working on ways to make sure we continue, or even enhance our ministries to each other and to the community.

And I hope we can really throw ourselves at the project. It will take some discipline and some courage, but I have no doubt we have it in us. And if we do our work well, I feel confident in saying that we will be even stronger as we come out the other end of this event, whenever that might be.

In these days, there will be times when our prayers will be coming "from out of the depths," but we have come to believe that the ears of our Lord are always attentive to the voice of our supplications. I invite you to read the rest of Psalm 130, because, while it starts out on a pretty dark note, it ends well. So shall it before us, as we remain faithful to our calling.

Vacation Bible School will be **at our church** this year.


