FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

You who live in the shelter of the Most High. who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, will say to the LORD, "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust." For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence; he will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler. Psalm 91:1-4 (NRSV)

On a recent Sunday, during worship, we read about Jesus who was headed to Jerusalem, and who, though pretty unhappy about the way the city had

behaved, claimed that he had always sought to protect the city, the way a mother hen protects her chicks under her wings.

Here we see the same sort of image from the Book of Psalms. The more you read about Jesus and the things he said, the more you conclude that he knew his psalms pretty well.

I used to raise little zebra finches (maybe I will again someday!). And one thing the hens will always do if you seem like you are a threat to their chicks is to cover the babies with their wings. I calculated once that I weighed about 1400 times what that mama finch weighed, so it was surely an act of courage to even think about trying to stop me from disrupting her nest.

Jesus, too, demonstrated courage and faith beyond compare—in seeking to lead and guide and protect his people. And it led, as we know, to a hilltop cross outside Jerusalem. This story is fundamental to each of us personally, and to our life as Christian congregation, and it needs to be told and heard over and over.

The story reminds us of the tremendous love God has for us every single day of our lives, and for all eternity.

The Rev. Joseph Andrews served as pastor of our church from 1928 to 1949. I am told that he ended each sermon with the same words. They are the words of the last line of the great old hymn of this season called "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross."

The words remind us of God's love, and the lengths to which God is willing to go to save us.

I hope you can be with us for the remainder of Lent and for the entire Easter season. Your presence would be a blessing, and I feel sure that you would feel blessed as well. And maybe you will get a chance to sing the words of that song:

"Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all."


