New Years Day is just a couple of days away, and the next time we worship in the sanctuary, it will be 2021. I don't know that anyone will miss 2020 all that much. There were blessings in the year, however, and I encourage you to count them, (name them one by one!) when you have a minute to reflect.

This Sunday in worship, we will be reading from the first chapter of John's Gospel. I would also encourage you to read that chapter some time this week.
